Commissioner Patty Sheehan:

- Hurricane Ian caused severe flooding over 1 foot which is beyond what the City infrastructure can handle. The City discharges into the St. Johns but the wind direction caused back up on the St. Johns making things worse. Trying to get the flood areas waste picked up first by Solid Waste. FEMA picked up some with the claw. They say it will take 3x longer than regular pick up. There were a lot of problems with lift stations overflowing. If you do not have a sewer clean out it is advised to get the OUC insurance to have it put in.
- FEMA disaster info is on orlando.gov
- Runoff on both sides of the wall in Dickson Azalea Park. A plan is forthcoming to address this.
- For the most part the swans in Lake Eola are ok after Ian. There swan roundup is November 12. This is where the annual care is done.
- The goose in Lake Lawsona is not part of the swan program and therefore the City can't help with it
- Cleanup on November 12 in Dickson Azalea and planting will be addressed after wall work is completed.
- Loud traffic noises coming from Robinson from Street Racing and Motorcycles. Email OPD to address issue.
- Speeding issue brought up on Brown and Thornton. Email OPD to address issues.

Officer Eddie Rosado:

- Stats for September 2022
 - 109 calls for service / September 2021 had 111 calls for service
 - 8 incidents / September 2021 had 23 incidents
 - 11 suspicious person calls, incidents and vehicular burglaries
 - Officer Rosado says if you see something say something. Call every time for suspicious persons with a description and location.

- Green apartment building on Central and Brown flooded. It backs up to Lake Lawsona.
- Large Tree went down just to the left of our neighborhood sign.
- Park Cleanup on November 12th from 9:30 to 12:30.
- Bridge Lighting on December 3rd. Targeting November 30th for volunteers to put lights on the bridge. This is the 26th year for the floating tree. Float needs replacing this year. Fundraiser raised \$1,200 which will help to cover the cost of the materials to build the replacement.
